Welcome to Community Service and Civic Engagement

Mission: The mission of Community Service and Civic Engagement at Bennett College is to serve as a liaison for students and community resources within the greater Greensboro, North Carolina area. Students are challenged to fulfill their civic responsibility by exploring various dimensions of entrepreneurship, global education, communication and social justice.

What is Community Service? Community Service is intentional volunteer work that benefits the local community. It is often done near the area where you live, so your own community reaps the benefits of your work. You do not get paid to perform community service, but volunteer your time. Community service can help many different groups of people: children, senior citizens, people with disabilities, even animals and the environment. Volunteers seek meaningful relationships with a community agency or an approved work site to perform duties that are dedicated to problem-solving initiatives in education, public safety, the environment, and other human needs. Through Community Service, student volunteers build networks and form partnerships that often lead to internship opportunities or full-time employment.

Why is Community Service important? The College has mandated that all students must complete a total of eighty (80) hours of Community Service before graduation. Transfer students must complete a minimum of twenty (20) hours for each year of matriculation at the College.

Where can I volunteer? Consulting the Community Services Resource Guide is an excellent place to match your individual interests and skills with one of many agencies in need of assistance. This guide includes community organizations, descriptions of assistance needed, and hours of operation. Students should call one of the organizations listed in this guide if they are interested in fulfilling their Community Services requirements.

COMMUNITY SERVICE PROPOSAL GUIDELINES

1. All proposals must be submitted at least **one (1) week prior to** the beginning date of the project. The proposal will be carefully reviewed and assessed by a program administrator within **two (2) business days**. If the agency or organization **is not** in the Community Service Resource Guide you must submit a proposal form. If the community service is linked to a campus organization the organization must submit a proposal form.
2. Obtain a supervisor: A supervisor is required to oversee student project participation and to keep an accurate account of hours obtained. A Bennett College student **cannot** be the project supervisor. The organization's advisor or volunteer coordinator contact should be the project supervisor.
3. A sign-up sheet and sign-in sheet to promote project participation will be provided to be completed in its **entirety** and returned to the community service office.
4. The project site's supervisor **MUST** be able to provide accurate and detailed information about services required for student participation.
5. The project site supervisor **MUST** submit a copy of the sign-up/in sheets at the end of the project.
6. Each student participating in the activity **MUST** complete a Community Service Documentation Form to receive credit for the project.
7. Please attach additional sheets of paper if there is not enough space on the forms for your documentation.
8. If you have questions as to what constitutes Community Service, please feel free to contact the Office of Campus Life. *For example: Donating money or clothing items is not a community service project. However, the persons or organization conducting the clothing or food drive can gain community service hours for preparation and completion of the project.*

NOTE: Submitting a Community Service Proposal and Civic Engagement form does not automatically constitute approval of a project.

COMMUNITY SERVICE DOCUMENTATION GUIDELINES

Community Service Documentation Guidelines

1. A Community Service Proposal Form must be submitted to Ms. Rachel Pridgen one **(1) week prior to** the project.
2. Students may volunteer with:
 - a. An approved community site.
 - b. Campus organizations upon approval once a proposal is submitted.
3. Students should document their volunteer experience via the Community Service Documentation and Civic Engagement form:
 - a. The documentation must reflect duties in the proposal that was submitted.
 - b. Documentation forms must be completed in their entirety. This includes project supervisor's signature, title, and phone number; and 2-3 sentences for statements listed on the form.
 - c. The project supervisor must sign the documentation sheet, for each day that you volunteer. Their signature verifies that you provided services for that particular day and for the time recorded.
 - d. **In order to receive credit a documentation form must be submitted to the Office of Campus Life by the end of the current semester.**
4. Students who wish to fulfill Community Service requirements during holidays and breaks should submit a Community Service Proposal form and obtain approval of the project prior to going on break.
 - a. In addition, a letter written on the organization's letterhead with dates of participation, specific duties performed and total number of hours completed must be submitted.
 - b. This letter must be signed by the community site supervisor listed on the proposal.
 - c. This letter may be mailed to the Office of Campus Life, Bennett College, 900 East Washington Street, Box 81, Greensboro, NC 27401 or brought to the Student Union Office E on the Second Floor.
